The 2013 Colori, 100% Colorino, shows the more austere, structured side of this indigenous Tuscan variety. Savory herbs, tobacco, spice and floral notes are pushed forward, while the dense, dark fruit that is such a Colorino signature is pushed more into the background. Above all else, the 2013 impresses with its persistence. The tannins are a bit rustic at this stage, but that is a relatively small criticism of a wine that delivers so much pleasure and character.

The 2015 Comeunavolta is a Sangiovese-based red, with dollops of Colorino, Canaiolo, Trebbiano and Malvasia, the sort of field blend that was once common in Tuscany, done entirely in tank. Fresh, floral and lifted, with expressive red-toned fruit and silky tannins, the 2015 is a midweight, refreshing red to drink now and over the next few years. I loved it.
